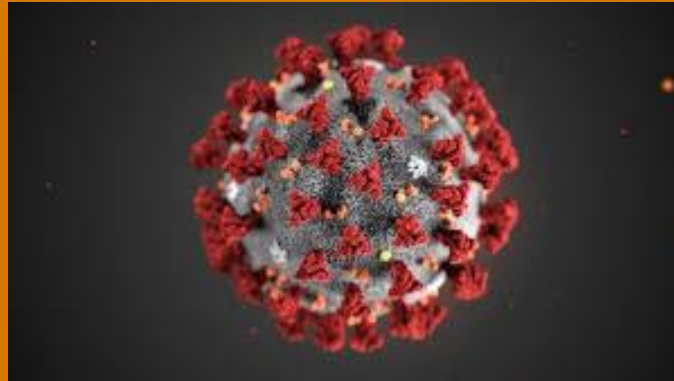

- After further reviewing medical records and communicating to the hospital, the resident was found to have contracted COVID-19 within the last 90 days. This prior incident of COVID-19 was the reason for this false positive test result.

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CDC Guidance on Visitation post Vaccination

On March 8, 2021, CDC provided guidance where fully vaccinated people can (*recommendations apply to non-healthcare settings*):

- Visit with other fully vaccinated people indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing
- Visit with unvaccinated people from a single household who are at low risk for severe COVID-19 disease indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing
- Refrain from quarantine and testing following a known exposure if asymptomatic

CDC Guidance on Visitation post Vaccination

The COVID-19 Taskforce interprets this guidance as:

- Vaccinated people may visit with other fully vaccinated people indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing
 - In this guidance "indoors" is defined as personal living spaces
 - Lenbrook common areas still require COVID-19 best practices

CDC Guidance on Visitation post Vaccination

The COVID-19 Taskforce interprets this guidance as:

- Vaccinated people can visit with unvaccinated people from a single household who are NOT at a HIGH RISK for severe COVID-19 disease in personal living spaces without wearing masks or physical distancing
 - CDC defines HIGH RISK PEOPLE as:
 - Older Adults
 - Pregnant People
 - People with Medical Conditions

CDC Guidance on Visitation post Vaccination

The COVID-19 Taskforce interprets this guidance as:

- Refrain from quarantine and testing following a known exposure if asymptomatic

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Vaccine Updates

What The CDC Knows and What They're Still Learning

- **CDC knows** that COVID-19 vaccines are effective at preventing COVID-19 disease, especially severe illness and death.
 - **They're still learning** how effective the vaccines are against variants of the virus that causes COVID-19. Early data show the vaccines may work against some variants but could be less effective against others.
- **CDC knows** that other COVID-19 Best Practices help stop the spread of COVID-19, and that these steps are still important, even as vaccines are being distributed.
 - **They're still learning** how well COVID-19 vaccines keep people from spreading the disease.
 - Early data show that the vaccines may help keep people from spreading COVID-19, but we are learning more as more people get vaccinated.
- They're still learning **how long** COVID-19 vaccines can protect people.

Vaccine Updates

According to the New England Journal of Medicine:

- It may take up to a few weeks for someone to achieve full effectiveness of the vaccine, depending on the individual
- The Pfizer vaccine showed to be 52% effective at preventing COVID-19 illness after the 1st dose
- The Pfizer vaccine showed to be 95% effective at preventing COVID-19 illness after the 2nd dose and at least 7 days post vaccination

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- **Residents**

- Everyone who is scheduled to participate in 3/11 second-dose clinic can proceed directly to the registration table to pick up their VAR form. Project Management has already completed your paperwork – please bring ID and Insurance card.

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Stepped Re-Opening Plan

- Using current info and current metrics – this is the very next step for Independent Living
 - HC and AL have to abide by federal regs and dept of community health
- Advance, pause, assess
- Continue to create a pathway to advance or regress
- Trigger to advance – two-week trend of declining:
 - **Internal metrics**
 - External metrics, and
 - 90%+ of our IL population 7 days post 2nd vaccine clinic

Visitation



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- Indoor visitation – Opening front entry plaza pending approval by the City of Atlanta
 - **March 15th – Pending Final Approval (Plan A)**
 - Our front entry plaza opens
 - One visitation per day
 - One car per visit and
 - Two visitors per car
 - **March 15th – Delayed Final Approval (Plan B)**
 - One visitation per day
 - One car per visit and
 - Two visitors per car
 - Visitation can only occur Mon thru Fri AFTER 3:30 PM & all day long over the weekend – Brookhaven Entrance



Visitation



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- Indoor visitation
 - **On Friday, March 12, 2021 a memo will be placed in your cubbies, on digital signage and K4 that clarifies which Plan, A or B, will go into effect.**
