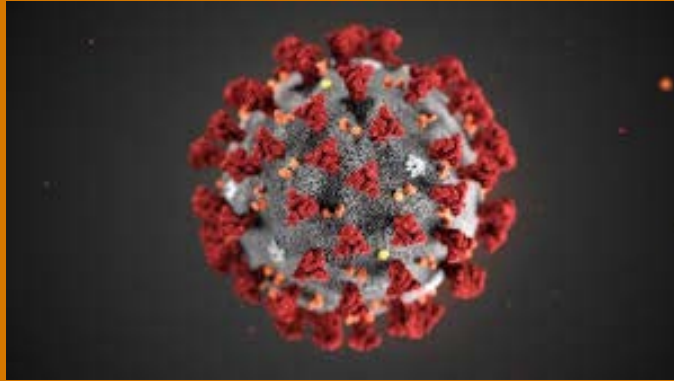

# Clinical Pathway

Collaboratively, based on the revised April 2 CDC guidance, the Resident COVID Task Force and Management Task Force reviewed the CDC guidance for fully vaccinated people and brought forth the question:

"Should mask usage in meeting rooms be required if all participants have all be fully vaccinated?"





# WHAT YOU CAN DO ONCE YOU HAVE BEEN FULLY VACCINATED

Visit inside a home or private setting without a mask with other fully vaccinated people of any age	✓
Visit inside a home or private setting without a mask with one household of unvaccinated people who are not at risk for severe illness	✓
Travel domestically without a pre- or post-travel test	✓

Travel internationally without a pre-travel test depending on destination	✓
Travel internationally without quarantining after travel	✓

After a very dynamic conversation with the Resident COVID Task Force and Management COVID Task Force we have revised our internal guidance for fully vaccinated people gathering in certain areas – Felecia will elaborate more.





# What We Know and What We're Still Learning

- We know that COVID-19 vaccines are effective at preventing COVID-19 disease, especially severe illness and death.
  - We're still learning how effective the vaccines are against variants of the virus that causes COVID-19. Early data show the vaccines may work against some variants but could be less effective against others.



# What We

# Know and What We're Still Learning

- We know that other prevention steps help stop the spread of COVID-19, and that these steps are still important, even as vaccines are being distributed.
  - We're still learning how well COVID-19 vaccines keep people from spreading the disease.
  - Early data show that the vaccines may help keep people from spreading COVID-19, but we are learning more as more people get vaccinated.



# Summary

- We're still learning.
- It is undeterred how long COVID-19 vaccines can protect people.
- CDC continues to update with recommendations for both vaccinated and unvaccinated people.
- Until we know more about those questions, everyone—even people who've had their vaccines—should continue taking steps to protect themselves and others when recommended.

# COVID 19 Best Practices



Lenbrook

- Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth to help protect yourself and others.
- Stay 6 feet apart from others who don't live with you.
- When outside, wear a mask when you can't stay six feet apart from others outside your household.
- Get a COVID-19 vaccine when it is available to you – remind families about the new guidelines on availability.
- Avoid crowds and poorly ventilated indoor spaces.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use hand sanitizer if soap and water aren't available.

# Stepped Re-Opening Plan

- Using current info and current metrics – this is the very next step for Independent Living
  - HC and AL have to abide by federal regs and dept of community health
- Advance, pause, assess
- Continue to create a pathway to advance or regress
- Trigger to advance – two-week trend of declining or stable:
  - **Internal metrics**
  - External metrics, and
  - 90%+ of our IL population 7 days post 2nd vaccine clinic

# Fully vaccinated people can start to

Gather indoors without masks or physical distancing with **other fully vaccinated people** in small groups in the following spaces (this includes your residence):

- Multi-purpose room
- Individual event center rooms (room a, room b, or c)
- Art Studio
- Woodworking shop
- Board Room
- Brookhaven Room
- Brookhaven Conference Room
- Multi-purpose room

# Considerations



Lenbrook

- Guidance for fully vaccinated people is for small groups – defined by COVID Task Force as less than 25 people
- Guidance applies to fully vaccinated people – we will revert back to CDC guidance for non-vaccinated people when one unvaccinated household at risk for severe illness is present
- We are testing this advancement in the opening plan with these designated rooms only. We will revisit further advancement in two weeks.



# Resident meetings in designated spaces – What To Expect

- Resident Council and management will provide guidance to all committee, task force and resident led activity **leaders**
- Leader of meeting to determine at start of meeting if group can follow guidance for fully vaccinated people or not
- Leader of meeting to ensure mask / distancing compliance based on the attendees present (e.g. if all in the meeting are fully vaccinated residents may remove masks)

# Visitation

- Outdoor visitation remains an option for the entire community

# Updates to visitation – Independent Living

- Indoor visitation for Independent Living
  - Monday, April 19th changes
  - Increasing from two visitors per visit to FOUR
    - One visit per day
  - Resident apartments, Plaza Gardens, no common areas yet

# Updates to visitation – Independent Living

- **Thur., April 15th - Dining with Guests**
  - Catering in your residence
  - Private dining for guests
    - Up to 8 total people in PDR (when available)
    - Up to 10 total people in Event Center (when available)
    - Contact a dining manager to schedule
  - **NEW! The Grill or The Brook at Lunch ONLY**
    - No reservations needed
    - Two- and Four-tops only right now
